Dr. Wojcik's research interests center on how pollinators interact with managed agriculture, industrial lands, and urban landscapes. Her graduate research focused on understanding the factors that influence the occurrence of bees in cities; her professional work looks at the health and wellbeing of pollinator systems in other anthropogenic landscapes. At the Pollinator Partnership (P2), a San Francisco-based nonprofit organization dedicated to the protection and promotion of pollinators and their habitats, she develops and manages research programs that fill significant data gaps in pollinator science. Dr. Wojcik is a member of the North American Pollinator Protection Campaign (NAPPC) and serves on other boards for organizations seeking to enhance the roles of pollinators in their industry. Victoria received her B.Sc. Honours from the University of Guelph (Ontario, Canada) in 2004 and her Ph.D. in Environmental Science, Policy, & Management from UC Berkeley in 2009.
